



MEAT Value Based Procurement Initiative

MedTech Europe in partnership with The Boston Consulting Group and procurement experts, has developed a framework and a simple Excel tool to stimulate discussions and make <u>MEAT Value-Based</u> <u>Procurement a reality.</u>

The <u>MEAT Value-Based Procurement</u> framework is a method which translates the EU Public Procurement Directive and national legislations on Best Quality/Price Ratio MEAT (Most Economic Advantageous Tendering) into practice, supporting the overall drive of health systems towards value-based health care.

To support the adoption and implementation of <u>MEAT Value-Based Procurement</u> framework for Medical Technology by procurement agencies and procurers, MedTech Europe (MTE) has created a "Fund" by calling for financial contributions to develop an extensive programme to promote the use of the MEAT Value-Based Procurement framework.

Specifically, such contributions will be dedicated to cover the costs borne by MedTech Europe in supporting this programme. The costs consist of the following categories: awareness, educational, pilots and training initiatives on the MEAT Framework and of the building of the Value Based Community of Practice (CoP). These initiatives will be defined in partnership with the procurement leaders and cover elements, such as, but not restricted to:

- Support to educational programmes on MEAT Value-Based Procurement framework
- Support to the case/experience-building via, for example, pilots
- Support to proctoring by (MEAT) Value-Based Procurement experts from the procurement community.
- Also, if necessary and properly authorised, attendance, travel and lodging of representatives from procurement agencies, (health) authorities, governmental organisations, hospitals, policy-makers, specialists and other experts participating to events in compliance with applicable laws and regulations
